Agenda Item I - Call to order and Invocation

Agenda Item II - Minutes

Agenda Item III - Finance

Abe Marshall presented the CIS of Robeson County January Financials to the board for approval. Lori Dove made a motion to approve the financials. Kim Woods seconded the motion; all were in favor and the motion carried. The Academy January financials were then presented to the board for approval. Jolee F. Marsh made a motion to approve the financials, Kim Woods seconded the motion; the motion carried. The CIS Treasurer's Report was then presented to the board, Gary Strickland made a motion to approve, and Lori Dove seconded the motion, the motion carried.

Agenda Item V - CIS Academy Report

Dencie Lambdin reporting for Principal, Billy Haggans, that the current enrollment is 114 students, and the attendance rate is 95.2%. The students went on the Second Reporting Period Field Trip to Mr. P's Skateworld. The Charter Renewal Site Visit was February 4, 2016. The Chancellor, Robin Cummings, from UNCP is going to visit the Academy on February 24, followed by a visit from our own Superintendent, Mr. Tommy Lowry, on February 25, 2016. Eighth graders will be registering for high school this spring. Plans are being made to replace the computers in the lab with lab tops for more classroom accessibility and to provide computers that line up with state testing requirements.

Agenda Item VI – Resource Development

Dencie Lambdin stated that we have raised \$30,000, thus far in our fundraising efforts. We will be at the Lumber on the Rumba on March 4, selling raffle tickets for a cruise donated by Debbie's Destinations. Our event is set for March 10, so everyone is encouraged to work hard on selling tickets to the event and the raffle tickets.

Agenda Item VII - Executive Director Report

Dencie's report states new TQS school site standards are ongoing with training in house and with CISNC. The Southeastern CISNC cohort will be held tomorrow at the UNCP Regional Center. Dencie and staff will be in attendance. Cammie Hunt and Angela Sumner will represent our board of directors and welcome the group. The new Website should be close to operational by March thanks to Breanna Branch. Saturday, February 27, we will be manning the Children's Corner at Book'Em which is to be held at RCC. Food Lion is planning to donate food items for BakPak pals as part of its quarterly community engagement donation. A Program Enhancement Plan for JCPC programming at Red Springs Middle will align program services with the protocol that the Dept. of Public Safety has set in place for JCPC funded agencies.
