Agenda Item I - Call to order and Invocation

Angela Sumner called the meeting into open session. Lori Dove gave the invocation. Sallie McLean, former Mayor of Maxton, was introduced as a new board member.

Agenda Item II - Minutes

The September minutes were presented to the board for approval by Angela Sumner. Lori Dove made a motion to approve the minutes. Cammie Hunt seconded the motion; all were in favor and the motion carried.

Agenda Item III - Finance

Oryan Lowery presented the CIS of Robeson County October Financials to the board for approval. Cammie Hunt made a motion to approve the financials. Herman Locklear seconded the motion; all were in favor and the motion carried. The Academy October Financials was then presented to the board for approval. Lori Dove made a motion to approve the Financials, Cammie Hunt seconded the motion; the motion carried. The CIS Treasurer's Report was then presented to the board, Janet Blue made a motion to approve, and Lori Dove seconded the motion, the motion carried. Oryan presented the budget revision for CIS of Robeson to increase the health benefit expense line. Sallie McLean made a motion to approve the CIS of Robeson Budget revisions as stated. Denise Fann seconded the motion; all were in favor and the motion carried. He then presented the CIS Academy budget revision for an increase in local money coming from E-rate reimbursement and final state allotment. Loir Dove made a motion to approve the CIS Academy budget revision as stated. Amanda Hunt seconded the motion; all were in favor and the motion carried. Buddy McLean then presented the 2014-5015, CIS Audit for approval. He stated that all records were in great condition and that there were no findings. Herman Locklear made a motion to

accept the CIS Audit. Cammie Hunt seconded the motion; all were in favor and the motion carried. He then presented the 2014-2015 CIS Academy Audit for approval. Buddy again stated that the statements were in great shape and there were no findings. Cammie Hunt made a motion to accept the 2014-2015 CIS Academy audit for approval, Amanda Hunt seconded the motion; all were in favor and the motion carried. Buddy McLean did suggest increasing the amount that CIS of Robeson is being paid for oversight and administration of the Academy. Dencie Lambdin was asked to excuse herself for the board to discuss her supplement. Angela Sumner, on behalf of the Finance Committee, then made a motion to provide a Christmas supplement for approval in the amount of \$1,966. Lori seconded the motion; all were in favor and the motion was carried.

Agenda Item V - CIS Academy Report

Dencie Lambdin reported that the current enrollment is 115 students, and the attendance rate is 95.5%. In October Ms. Mimi Herman, Poet, conducted a poetry class. The CIS Academy Benchmark Assessment using Schoolnet was completed in October and all NCEES evaluations for teachers were completed.. The students went on a field trip to the POE Center at the first of November. The Charter School self-study is due in mid-December and Title II desktop reviews with be conducted in January.

Dencie Lambdin presented an update to the 2013 Wellness Policy to the board for approval. Denise Fann made a motion to approve the revisions to the Wellness Policy. Cammie Hunt seconded the motion; all were in favor and the motion carried.

Agenda Item VI - Executive Director Report

Dencie reported that an MOA has been signed with Cooperative Extension to provide after school services, CISNC has provided Kindles for Readers Playhouse, an interactive way of providing reading comprehension strategies, to Tanglewood Elementary and Townsend Middle Schools, a value of \$4,000. She has initiated a grant request to United Way of Robeson County for Building Blocks funding in the amount of \$16,000 and a request to Kiwanis for \$1,500. Staff development continues for the new standards at school sites. Business standards will be brought forward in January, 2016. CIS is working collaboratively with Book 'Em and Robeson Community College to provide entertainment for the Children's Corner at the event in February.
